

Wednesday January 11, 1837.

Met according to adjournment.

Mr Strickland, from the Committee to which was recommended the Senatorial votes, so far as relates to the case of Edward Robinson of the Third Senatorial District, made a report, and further proceedings on the same, were, on motion of Mr Magoun, postponed till tomorrow at ten o'clock.

On motion of Mr Magoun, The Senate reconsidered their vote of yesterday, whereby they proposed a convention of the two Houses, this day at eleven o'clock for the purpose of electing Counsellors and Secretary of State, and propose a Convention of the two Houses in the Representatives Hall, tomorrow at eleven o'clock, for the same purposes - of which the House was informed by message and their concurrence requested.

A message was received from the House of Representatives, that that Body had concurred with the Senate in their reconsideration and proposition for a convention of the two Houses, tomorrow at eleven o'clock, to choose seven Counsellors, and Secretary of State.

Mr Strickland, announced to the Board that Marshall W. Whitney, Senator elect from the South Senatorial District, was present and ready to take and subscribe the necessary oaths.
