

assigned to Col: Waters, and as he finally adjusted
the matter he must be a loser of £2112.3 unless
the proprietors chuse to make him any consideration,
of the expediency of any being made and the nature
of it, your Committee have not thought proper to
decide, but left the same for your Determination.

It also appears that in consequence of running
a ^{new} divisional Line, between the town of Landford
and Waterborough the Lots N: 31 and 32 falls short
of the original Estimate together 49 Acres + 100 Rods
and this Lot N: 4 falls short 38 Acres - the two
former falling to Col: Waters by the Division and
latter to the Commonwealth, your Committee have
not a doubt on their Minds respecting the Propriety
making good these deficiencies, and would recommend
that an assignment of such part of Lot N: 26
which was reserved for contingencies, and the
surplusage part of Lot N: 101 be appropriated
for that purpose as shall be equivalent thereto
and your Committee with Respect subscribe
themselves your obedient & Humble^d
