Petition of William Vance and others, praying for a Bank and High School at Headfield came up from the House referred to the Committee on Literature and Literary Institutions. The Senate reconsidered their vote of the 13th inst. referring said petition to the Committee on Banks and Banking and refer the same to the Committee on Literature and Literary Institutions, in concurrence.

Petition of Abel Chapman Jr. praying for pecuniary aid in consequence of wounds received while doing military duty, came up from the House of Representatives, referred to the Committee on Claims. The Senate nonconcur the House in their reference, and refer the same to the Committee on Military Pensions. Sent down for concurrence.
