And the Committee do also recommend that the deeds to
those persons be immediately made out and executed, so that an
assignment of the property received of them, or the security given
by them, may be made to those who have demands on the
proprietors, agreeably to the aforementioned mode - The
Committee finds, that the six following Lots although agreed
to be sold by Colonel Waters are included in the Lots to
be divided, and whoever they may fall to must necessarily
comply with the agreement made by him with them &
ratified by the proprietors at their meeting
