A. Yes sir. The whole of that steam is not allowed to pass there. It would be too ^{much} ~~hot~~ heat.

Q. Don't you think the air is very much better since you work the ^{cold} air from the outside instead of from the basement?

A. Yes, sir. We tried it one winter on one wing and satisfied ourselves it was a great deal better.

And the question of economy came in. Experience is leading us to believe that it is economy to do so. Several little changes have been made this winter which will probably result in a saving of several hundred dollars through the holes.
