Mr Littlefield, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported leave to withdraw on petition of the Trustees of the School Fund in Freeman, and John Smith and others; — legislation inexpedient on an order relative to taxing owners of timber — relative to the Divorce Law, and relative to criminal prosecutions; — reference to next Legislature on petition of A. S. Patten and others, and Alpheus Davison and others, Bill to extend the powers of the City of Portland, and an order relative to the removal of Judicial Officers — and that the accounts of Sheriffs for 1836 (transmitted to the Legislature by the Secretary of State) be placed upon the files of the Senate — read and accepted.

Sent down for concurrence. Concurred.

The same Gentleman, from the same Committee, to which were referred the petition of D. Bronson and others, and an order relative to the appointment of County Commissioners, reported a "Bill providing for the election of County Commissioners," and that the same be referred to the next Legislature — read and accepted.
