Ahlermbague nosis. pl. Ahlermbague noseésuc

The little people who live under the water. Probably spelled Aleumbague nosis but pronounced as above. alumbague (under the water) no (signifying, a person) sis (little).

Pamiólā (pronounced by Clara bamiólā) the giant

Marjer hoidu - bad spirit, devil.

Mitche-kant, Sys Leland 117. "Major Hindoo", my grandmother used to say, using it often as an exclamation. She got it from Indian servants

No-ta-la - Come get me

ho-ta-la-ne - Come get two of us

pehe' kasátebeú - cooking ready.
