Q. What is the difference of per centage between the charges of goods to patients and the prices paid for them, or cost of them?

Ans. The goods cost what it costs to put them on the shelves. I should say the advance may be some where from 3 to 4 percent, but think it might be as low as 3. On some goods, such as dry goods, mens clothing and that sort, and on boots and shoes, we charge as a rule 10 per cent above cost price at the place where the goods are purchased. The cost of getting these goods there includes transportation and expenses of going and buying them.
