the like proceedings shall be continued by the respective branches until an election be effected or further attempts be considered unavailing. In the event of the House of Representatives failing to come to an election, on their part, after their four first ballottings, and of the Senate not coming to a choice on their part, after having taken four ballots, the Senate shall cease to ballot and notify the House thereof, whereupon the House shall assign a subsequent day for coming to a choice on their part, and similar proceedings, as before provided, shall be repeated until an election be effected.

Bill providing for the disposition and repayment of the public money, apportioned to the State of Maine, on deposit, by the Government of the United States (reported by Mr. Crane, from the Joint Select Committee on so much of the Governor's Message as relates to the Surplus Revenue,) on motion of Mr. Littlefield, was laid upon the table and ordered that 1000 copies of said Bill be printed for the use of the Legislature.
