of judgment, but I should say not more than 50

Q. A disease of the brain? A. Not always,
The nervous system is disturbed almost invariably.

Q. Do you have insanity without disease
of the brain do you think? A. I
think the brain suffers more than any
other organ in insanity.

Q. But you do not consider it a specific
disease? A. No, sir. I have seen
insanity from hypochondria in my own practice
