Robinson of Kennebec, Harris, Green, Burr and Magoun be a committee with such as the House may join, to report the time, place and manner to be prescribed by the Legislature of this State, ^{in making choice of a Senator from this State} in the Senate of the United States—read and passed.

Sent down for concurrence, concurred and Messrs. Barker of Lincoln, Potter of Sebago, Hamlin of Hiram, Stevens of Pittston, Russell of Norridgewock, Small of Bradford, Hinckley ^{of Bradbury}, Parsons of Mulport, Chase of Camden and McLellan of Eastport, are joined.
