

or who are by law specially or exclusively protected in the same, shall on or before the first day of May annually, make under oath, to the clerk of the city, towns or plantation in which such persons or persons may reside, a correct return of all business severally done by him or them for twelve months next preceding the date of said return, with the gross amounts of the income arising therefrom, and the nett amount actually received by such person or persons respectively

Sec 4 Be it further enacted, "That similar returns shall on the first day of January, in each year, be made to the Office of the Secretary of State, to be by him laid before the Legislature at the time named in the second section of this Act" and the question of adopting said amendments was decided in the Negative by yeas and nays, as follows, to wit:

Yeas. Messrs Burr, Green, Littlefield, Robinson of Lincoln, Soule, Strickland, Swift and Woodbury \_\_\_\_\_ 8.

Nays. Messrs Carr, Higgins, Manning, Mildsarr, Robinson of Kennebec, Rogers, Smith, Talbot, Whitney and Woodman \_\_\_\_\_ 10.

Mr Littlefield proposed further to amend said Bill and while the same was under discussion the Senate
