upon any course to recommend to the Senate—
read and the same, on motion of Mr. Benson
was laid upon the table.

and others) was read once and laid upon
the table, and ordered on motion of Mr. Sever-
ance, that 500 copies of the same be printed
for the use of the Legislature.
