 in the dances and seem to enjoy it
 very much. I should say the patients
 certainly get benefit from that part of thing.
 I don't think that as a rule the
 patients join much in the singing; they
 may in the singing of hymns. But
 I am not often present in the hall
 unless something else calls me. I frequently
 hear them singing but who joins I
 cannot say. There is a piano in the
 hall in addition to the one in the
 amusement hall. The patients assemble for
 regular devotional exercises. This has
 been so for many years. The
 hospital is supplied with a very good
 library indeed, and well selected I judge.
 The patients use those books very much
 indeed. A great many patients of both
 sexes occupy more or less time reading.
 They are furnished with newspapers and
 they seem to appreciate that. I think it
 will be understood that a great many
 of them are still informed about current
