Met according to adjournment.

On motion by Mr Holmes of Alfred

Ordered, That the Committee on the Judiciary
be instructed to inquire into the expediency of pro-
ceeding by law for obtaining lands for burying grounds
in towns or villages without the consent of the
owners, when such consent cannot be obtained on
payment of an equivalent as provided by the
Constitution. Sent up for concurrence.

The report accepted in concurrence.

Resolve for the benefit of the town of Kilmarnock
was read once and tomorrow at 10 o'clock assigned
for a second reading.
