The following orders came up from the House of Representatives, to wit: Instructing the Committee on the Judiciary to inquire into the expediency of altering the law providing for the return day of Executions, issued by authority of the S. A. Court, Courts of Common Pleas and Justices of the Peace, so that those issued by authority of either of said Courts shall be made returnable to the next Court sitting in the same County, after date of said Executions, and those issued by Justices of the Peace shall be made returnable in six months from the date thereof.

Instructing the Committee on the Judiciary to inquire into the expediency of so amending the law, authorizing guardians to dispose of the real estate of their wards at private sale, that publications of the time and place of such sale may be dispensed with.

Instructing the Committee on the Judiciary to inquire into the expediency of providing by law that the plaintiff shall be allowed cost of witnesses in actions which shall have been set down for trial on the Clerk's Docket and afterwards defaulted, severally read and passed, in concurrence.
