Order from the House of Representatives instructing the Committee on Interior Waters to inquire and ascertain what if any alteration is necessary in the law giving to the owners of logs and other lumber a free passage of the same down all the Rivers in this State read and passed, in concurrence.

Order from the House of Representatives, directing the Committee on the Judiciary to inquire into the expediency of making further provisions by law for the support of the Poor residing in unincorporated plantations, when they shall become chargeable to any town or shall make application to any adjoining town for relief and that such adjoining town may have a legal claim on the town wherein the residence of such pauper is established. read and passed, in concurrence.

Petition of John Hanley praying to be admitted as an Attorney to practice law. read and referred to a Joint select Committee, consisting of Messrs. Staples, Gunn, and Robinson of Lincoln with such as the House may join. Sent down for concurrence.
