The Senate, on motion of Mr. Smith, re-considered the vote of yesterday refusing a passage to the "Resolves authorizing further appropriations for continuing the Geological Survey of the State" and the question of passing said Resolves to be engrossed was decided in the negative, (passage refused as follows, to wit:

Mr. Ham, from the Conference on the part of the Senate, on the disagreement of the two Houses on the "Resolves authorizing the distribution of the first Report of the Geology of the State," reported that the Conference had agreed to amend the amendment of the House, marked B — read and accepted. And said Resolves passed to be engrossed with the amendment C and the amendment B amended.
