

Petitions of Inhab. of Bloomfield -

of Abraham Wyman & others for a change of the name of the town of Bloomfield to Kewhegan, were severally read & referred to the Committee who have under consideration the petition of Samuel Weston & others - Sent up for concurrence.

Petition of Moses White for a township of settling lands on certain conditions -

was read & referred in concurrence to the Committee on State Lands. Sent up for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Wait of Falmouth.

Ordered, That the Land Agent be requested to transmit to this House the facts relating to one John Mason of Falmouth deceased who was an enlisted soldier in the late revolutionary war.

On motion by Mr. Holmes of Alfred,

Ordered, That the Committee on the Judiciary be instructed to inquire into the expediency of providing by law for ceding to the United States jurisdiction over sites or places designated for the erection of forts, magazines, arsenals, dock yards & other useful buildings, and to enable the United States to hold lands for such purposes. Sent up for concurrence.

Bill An Act to annex a tract of land to Waldo Plantation, was read a 3^d time & passed to be engrossed in concurrence.

Bill An Act further regulating Judicial Proceedings came from the Senate indefinitely postponed - The House nonconcurred & read the Bill 1st & 2^d time and tomorrow at 10 o'clock was assigned for a third reading.
