Mr. Littlefield, from the Conference on the part of the Senate on the disagreeing vote of the two Houses in relation to the "Bill to enlarge the Jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace in civil cases", reported that the Conference of the two Houses could not agree, therefore recommended that the Senate adhere to the vote refusing said Bill a passage—read and accepted.

Report on "Resolve in favor of William Anson" was taken up and recommitted.

Sent down for concurrence. Concurred.

Bill additional concerning Meeting Houses was taken up, and the same, on motion of Mr. Soule, was referred to the next Legislature.

A message was received from the House of Representatives, that it had reconsidered its vote passing to be engrossed "Bill respecting lumber in Wenduskeag Stream", amended the same, and passed said Bill to be reengrossed as amended—and asked the concurrence of the Senate.

The Senate reconsider the vote passing the same to be engrossed, adopt the amendment proposed by the House, and order the Bill reengrossed as amended in concurrence.

Bill concerning the Municipal Court at Lowell, (introduced in the House,) was read twice and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.
