Order from the House of Representatives, instructing the Committee on the Judiciary to enquire whether it is proper and expedient to address the Governor to remove any Judicial Officer of the State, agreeably to the provisions of the Constitution—read and passed in concurrence.

Petition of David Winslow and others, praying to be set off from Westbrook to Portland—read and referred to the Committee on Division of Towns.

Sent down for concurrence. Concurred.

Petition of Samuel Wright and others, of Wilford and adjacent towns in Crenseck County, praying that the Surplus Revenue be appropriated for the construction of a Rail Road from New Hampshire line to Bangor—read and referred to the Committee on the Surplus Revenue, in concurrence.

Petition of Alfred Johnson and others, Committee of a convention of citizens held at Belfast praying the Legislature to subscribe in behalf of the State, for a portion of the stock of the Belfast and Lubec Rail Road—read and referred to the Committee on Rail Roads and canals and ordered that 1000 copies of the same be printed for the use of the Legislature, in concurrence.
