

concurrent vote of both branches of the Legislature, 161.
and a majority of all the votes given in each
branch respectively: that the House of Representa-
-tives shall on Wednesday, the fifteenth day of the
current month at ten of the o'clock in the fore-
-noon, proceed to the choice of a Senator on their
part by ballot, and continue to ballot until
a choice on their part be effected or until they
shall have balloted four times without ef-
-fecting a choice, and then upon the House
shall cease to ballot, and inform the Senate
by message of the election or failure to elect on
their part, whereupon, the Senate shall at
twelve of the o'clock of the same day, proceed
to elect a Senator on their part by ballot,
and if an election is made on the part of the
House, and the Senate concurs in electing
the same persons on their part, it shall con-
-stitute an election. But if the Senate elect
on their part a person other than the one elect-
-ed on the part of the House, the Senate shall
notify the House thereof by Message, and the
House shall then upon assign some subse-
-quent day for coming to an election on their
part, and if upon such trial the House shall
concur with the Senate, in electing on their
part the same person as was elected on the part
of the Senate, the persons thus chosen shall be
considered duly elected a Senator from this
State in the Congress of the United States. But
if the House upon trial shall not concur with
the Senate, and on their part elect a person other
than the one chosen by the Senate, the House
shall notify the Senate thereof by Message, and
