 by a strap with a part of staple.
 That has been discarded. In addition
 to that there were leather muffs. Those
 went with a belt round the ~~waist~~
 waist with wrists fastened to it.
 We have discarded all the "muffs"
 in the institution except one. The only
 other remaining apparatus of restraint
 is the camisade. The belt and
 wrists we now sometimes use
 without the "muff", more without the muff
 than with it. There is only one
 muff there, ^{and} not more than 3 or 4 belts-
 I think now. We use a good
 many of the camisades. [Belt and
 wrists produced and its use explained]
 That is used to prevent striking or
 injury to themselves or others. We have
 used it some what within the last year;
 but I don't remember as it was used
 much before that for many years,
 only occasional that it is brought out.
 We use the belt and wrists very
 frequently. It has not been used
 on the female side for many years.
