Sent down for concurrence. The House adhered.

The Senate, on motion of Mr. Littlefield, recon-  
sidered the vote passing to be engrossed the "Bill to  
incorporate the Kennebec Hotel Company," amon-  
ded the same by adding after the word "subject,"  
in the 7<sup>th</sup> line, 2<sup>d</sup> Section, the words, to all the duties,  
requirements, limitations and restrictions contained  
in the several acts now in force relating to corpo-  
rations, and — and order the Bill to be reene-  
grossed as thus amended, — of which the House  
was informed by message and its concurrence  
requested. Concurred.

Bill establishing the Salary of the Secretary of State  
came up — the House, having insisted on its vote  
referring said Bill to a Joint Select Committee,  
propose a Conference, and appoint as Confereres  
Messrs. Knowlton of Montville, Levensaler of  
Thomaston and Gowen of Shopleigh.

The Senate insist on the vote passing said Bill  
to be engrossed, concur in the proposition for a  
Conference, and appoint as Confereres Messrs.  
Greene, Magoun and Burr.

Bill to incorporate the Winslow Lock and Dam Com-  
pany was read the second time and recommitted.
