

Voted that a Committee be appointed to give deeds  
to the said Settlers with whom the said Agent has  
made the aforesaid Agreement and they be empowered  
to receive payment for said Lands either in Money  
or in the Mortgage of the said Lands sold to the said

of the Propriety

Voted - That the Propriety hereby accept and  
ratify the proceedings of this Agent so far as  
respects the Agreement made by him with  
certain persons named in said Agreement Dec.  
6<sup>th</sup> 1781 and do that a Committee be appointed and  
fully authorized, and empowered in the name and  
behalf of the Propriety to execute deeds to the  
said persons and such others as they may think  
proper not exceeding thirty in the whole

Voted that the Committee consist of three and  
that Mr. John Bromfield, Col<sup>o</sup> Josiah Waters  
and John Svery jun<sup>r</sup> be and they are hereby  
appointed for the above purposes and said  
Committee are desired to draught a form of a  
deed to be given to those persons who have settled  
upon the Lands of the Proprietors holden under  
Bondget Phillips and report the same to the said  
Proprietors at their next meeting

Voted to adjourn to Thursday the sixteenth Day  
of March instant to meet at the Coffee House  
in Boston at Six o'clock P. M. and said meeting  
is accordingly adjourned
