And the question of this positioning was decided in the affirmative, as follows, to wit:

Yeas Messrs. Burr, Carr, Ham, Littlefield, Manning, J. R. Redman, Rogers, Soule, Staples, Strickland, Swift and Woodbury — 12.

Nays. Messrs. Benson, Higgins, Edward Robinson, Severance, Smith, Talbot, Whitney and Woodman — 8

Bill enlarging the Jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace in civil cases came up — the House, having insisted on its vote passing the same to be engrossed, proposed a Conference, and appointed as Conferees Messrs. Coney of Augusta, Oaks of Sangerville and Merritt of Jay.

The Senate, insisting on the vote refusing said bill a passage, concur in the proposition for a Conference, and appoint as conferees Messrs. Littlefield, Benson and Woodman.

The Senate, on motion of Mr. Benson, reconsider their vote of Friday last, passing the order directing the Secretary of the Senate to make up the Pay Roll of the Senate including Tuesday, then next.
