Ans. I felt that there had been a great improvement in the matter of attendants. I think as a rule they were as faithful to their duties as that number of individuals selected by a private individual for his business would be found.

Ques. When you first became one of the visiting committee had they introduced the various sorts of amusements which are there now. Ans. There have been some additions made, have progressed in that respect.
