Q. In ordinary cases? A. No sir. If the female were equally skilled with the male in the care and treatment of insanity and diseases peculiar thereto, I should prefer the male or the female physician, for the reasons I have already given. I believe insane patients are more easily managed and controlled by a man than by a female, from the best information I can get from those who have had experience in different hospitals and from what impressions I have got from my own observation.

Q. Do you say that in general practice women are, as a rule, more willing or desirous to submit to the treatment of a man than of a woman? and especially including those cases where the services of the lady are particularly? A. I have to say to answer the question that the class of diseases to which you refer is very generally treated by a male physician.
