

Tuesday, March 7th 1837

The following orders from the House of Representatives, to wit: Instructing the Committee on the Judiciary to inquire into the expediency of providing that the State shall indemnify the towns for expenses incurred by them in the support of the paupers having no residence in this State — to inquire into the expediency of passing an Act, so that any criminal who may escape from another State to this, may be speedily brought to justice in the State from whence he escaped — to inquire into the expediency of repealing an Act entitled an Act concerning apignments, approved April 1st 1836. — also to inquire into the expediency of increasing the pay of Grand Jurors for their attendance at any Judicial Court in this State — requesting the Committee on State Roads to inquire into the expediency of making an appropriation for the repair of the Mass Hill Road, so called — directing the Committee on the Militia to inquire into the expediency of appropriating the sum of Fifty Dollars, ^{to each Regiment of Militia} for the purpose of procuring musical instruments, for a Band for such Regiments — also to inquire into the expediency of exempting ^{members of} Hook and Ladder Companies from Military duty — severally read and passed, in concurrence.
