The rafts were built on the back side of Cassa Is. l. The Moheuks landed their rafts on the head of the Island up near the Cocks. Word got out Oldton Indians were on the sea shore fishing. The few left, not the women, came themselves through at where they got up the Oak Hill ~~up~~ down a far as Joseph Mitchell's house they tried to cross the river. The Oldton men found fire on the Moheuks. & a war chief was killed. The Moheuks buried their chief by night & disheartened, abandoned the war. The chief was buried on the west side where Joseph Mitchell's house is, across the lagoon. Leroy knows the story and adds that they took him up later & carried him off with them, and that it was the last time the Moheuks saw come.

Frank knows nothing of tribute being exacted, but says the wars were long continued, constant warfare for years. When he was a boy, he thinks in 48 or 50, when Arthur was elected that some Moheuks ~~came~~ here and took part in the inauguration ceremonies. With this is the first occasion when Clara Weston ~~arrived~~
