Order from the House of Representatives instructing the Committee on the Militia to inquire into the expediency of appropriating the sum of One Hundred Dollars for the finishing of the Gun House in Wilton. — read and passed in concurrence.

Ordered that the Committee on the Judiciary be instructed to inquire what alterations, if any, are necessary in the law regulating the licensing of Pedlars of tin ware within this State. — read and passed.
