Ques. What did you see of the kicking by Mr. Seice at the time spoken of. Ans. On my morning rounds I saw this scuffle between him and the patient, saw his foot go towards him and taken away; I spoke to him quickly, he did not know I was near. We had some words about it, I told him I would see about it, he finally came to my office and I told him I could not overlook it, he better settle with the treasurer.
