Petition of the Selectmen of the town of Livermore praying for a repeal or modification of the act relating to triangular Sleds - read and referred to the Committee on Roads and Bridges, in concurrence.

Bill to incorporate the Oxford Manufacturing Company, (introduced in the House) read and referred to the Committee on Manufactures, in concurrence.

Petition of Isaac Mansfield and others, praying to be incorporated by the name of the "Penobscot Land and Water power Company" - read and referred to the next Legislature.  
Sent down for concurrence. Concurred.

Mr. Woodbury, from the Committee on Division of Towns, reported order of notice to next Legislature on petition of John Newbegin and others - read and accepted.  
Sent down for concurrence. Concurred.

Bill providing for the repeal of an act entitled an act to establish a Municipal Court in the town of Hallowell came up from the House further amended. The Senate recede from their vote passing said Bill to be engrossed. And the question of adopting the amendment C, proposed by the House, to strike out the words "in town affairs", and insert in lieu thereof the words, at such meeting, being ordered to be taken
