Order from the rd House of Representatives, appointing Messrs Campbell of Granbury, Clark of Berwick, Potter of Sebago, Libbey of Cutton and Conner of Fairfield, a Committee, with such as the Senate may join, to inquire what alterations, if any, are necessary in the law regulating the collection of non-resident taxes in this State - read and passed and Messrs Burne, Robinson of Seinecton and J. Redman are joined in concurrence.

Petition of Charles Robbins and others, praying for a more effectual law prohibiting the retailing of spirituous liquors - read and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, in concurrence.
