On motion by Mr Humphrey of Gray,

Ordered, That the Clerk cause a Book case to be erected on each side of the Speaker between the windows, not to exceed eight inches in depth, at the expense of the State.

Ordered, That the Committee on the Judiciary be instructed to inquire into the expediency of providing by law that no town shall be liable to a presentment or Indictment by any grand jury in consequence of a defect in any road unless the Complainant or complainants shall first give the Selectmen reasonable notice that such road or roads are out of repair & are unsafe & dangerous for teams and carriages to pass thereon.
