Ordered, that a message be sent to the House of Representatives, proposing a Convention of the two Houses, in the Representatives Hall, this day at eleven o'clock, for the purpose of qualifying Samuel Small, Councilor elect, who has signified his acceptance and readiness to take and subscribe the oaths of office - Which message was delivered by the Secretary.

A message was received from the House of Representatives concurring in the foregoing proposition.

### In Convention.

The two Houses agreeably to apignment, met in Convention, for the purpose of qualifying Samuel Small, Councilor elect.

M<sup>r</sup> Nicors of Sweden, of the House, was charged with a message, informing Samuel Small that the two Houses of the Legislature have met in Convention, and are ready to administer to him the necessary oaths.

When upon, Samuel Small came in, and before the Presidents of the Conventions, and in presence of both Houses of the Legislature took and subscribed the oaths required by the Constitution.
