John H. Smith, Senator elect from the Tenth Senatorial District, being present and signifying his readiness to take and subscribe the necessary oaths, was, by M^{rs} Manning conducted to the Governor and Council, before whom he took and subscribed the oaths required by the Constitution to qualify him to enter upon the discharge of his official duties, and took his seat at the Senate Board.

On motion of M^{rs} Strickland,
Ordered, that a message be sent to the House of Representatives, proposing a Convention of the two Branches in the Representatives Hall to-morrow at eleven o'clock for the purpose of electing seven Counsellors to advise the Governor in his executive duties for the current political year, and also for the choice of Secretary of State, and request their concurrence.

Which message was delivered by the Secretary

A message was received from the House of Representatives, that that body had concurred with the Senate in the foregoing propositions.

The Senate reconsidered their vote of yesterday, where-by they ordered one thousand copies of all the documents accompanying the Governor's Message, and Order that 1000 copies of said documents be printed, with the exception of the Adjutant General's Report, in concurrence with the House.
