

more frequent changes in some instances and a greater amount of watchfulness, but I doubt whether it would be for the comfort of the patients. There are many cases that are inclined to be a little loose and careless about their clothing, and I think they are more comfortable to be so, providing always that they have clothing enough to keep them warm. The point as to their being kept warm I think is generally observed.

I should say the discipline among the attendants is very good, and that they regard themselves as under responsibility through various subordinate officers, ~~but~~ <sup>to</sup> one general head, and also directly to that head.

Q. What has been your observation as to the degree of watchfulness exercised by Dr. Barber? A. My opinion about that has changed a little since I first went there. At first the very quiet manner of dealing with his business led me to suppose that he was not noticing as sharply as I had seen some men do. I have changed my mind about that very much. I think he is very observing;
