

Saturday March 18, 1837.

The President being absent the Senate was called to order by the Secretary.

On motion of Mr. Soule,
Ordered, That the Senate now proceed to elect
a President pro tem. and that a Committee of
three be appointed to receive, sort and count
the votes.

Mesrs. Soule, Burr (and) Severance were
appointed said Committee, who, having atten-
ed the duties assigned them, reported that the
whole number of votes was 15
