They followed & after a few days reached a hole in an old camp with an Atkatooka a hole fr. wh. the great water was long. Parrooks were scattered, being a party's head on the Atkatooka pointing toward meeting place. Parrooks were camped just then at the head of Lake Parrook & had completed arrangements for wopce sugar making. The Atkatooka camped to the right at the foot of the lake & each one of them hurried up to the (over)
