Order from the House of Representatives appointing Messrs Lowell of East Machias, Paine of Sanford; Appleton of Portland, Paris of Buckfield, and Sheldon of Gardiner a Committee with such as the Senate may join, to inform the Governor that the two Houses of the Legislature have passed upon all the business before them, and are ready to adjourn without day— read and passed and Messrs Soule, Edward Robinson and J. W. Kidman were joined in concurrence.

Which Committee, having attended to the duties assigned them, reported that the Governor was pleased to say, that he would forthwith communicate by message through the Secretary of State to both branches of the Legislature, and after that he had no further communication to make.
