Officers came up - The House, having insisted on  
its vote passing the same to be engrossed, proposed  
a Conference and appointed as Conferees Messrs  
Hubbard of Wiscasset, Godman of Portland, and  
Gitchell of Anson. The Senate, insisting on the  
vote indefinitely postponing the same, concur in  
the proposition for a Conference, and appoint as  
Conferees Messrs. Woodbury, Woodman and  
Burr.

Bill to provide, in part, for the expenditures  
of Government, (reported in the House by the Com-  
mittee on Finance) was read twice and passed  
to be engrossed, as amended, in concurrence.

Petition of W. W. Rand and others, Students at  
Bowdoin College, praying to be exempted from  
Military duty - read and referred to the next  
Legislature with instructions to examine into the  
expediency of exempting all minors who come  
from other States to labor in this State, in  
concurrence.

Order from the House of Representatives di-  
recting that the "Bill additional concerning Meet-  
ing Houses," referred to the next Legislature, be  
published in all the papers that publish the  
Laws of the State, six weeks successively, the last  
publication to be two weeks prior to the meeting  
of the Legislature. - read and passed, in con-  
currence.
