

Monday January 9th 1837.

Met according to adjournment.

Mr^s Strickland announced to the Board that Jonathan Swift, Senator elect from the eleventh Senatorial District was present and ready to take and subscribe the necessary oaths. He was conducted by Mr^s Strickland to the Governor and Council, before whom, he took and subscribed the oaths required by the Constitution to qualify him to enter upon the discharge of his official duties and took his seat at the Senate Board.

A communication was received from Asa Bedington Sr Treasurer of State, exhibiting the state of the finances read, and the same, on motion of Mr^s Mildrum, was referred to a Joint Select Committee, consisting, on the part of the Senate, of Messrs Mildrum, Severance, and Burr with such as the House may join.
