1664 June 2. Major William Phillips of Saco, purchased of Wescumb or Mecksombe alias Captain Sunday, three hills of rocks with woods meadows and all appurtenances thereunto belonging, lying and being situated above Saco falls, about 35 or 40 miles more or less up into the Country — Signed sealed and delivered in presence. Nathl. Phillips, John Spooner and Dennis Dryland and Sarah Harmon — recorded July 31. 1717 York County Lib. 8 fol. 220. —

N.B. The above are the deeds of conveyance of lands to William Phillips under whom the present proprietary lay claim to the land between the Osages. —

Novem<sup>r</sup>. 28. 1666. Francis Small of Osagee purchases of Wescumb alias Captain Sunday a tract of land, beginning at the little river called Newechewanany river, over against Humphrey Chabourne his log house and from thence on an imaginary line to Cape Popoize river, being by computation twenty miles and so from thence, on imaginary lines, to make it up twenty miles square — Signed sealed & delivered in presence of Witnesses — Recorded in York County May 24. 1713 Lib. 23 fol. 238 — See N<sup>o</sup>. 2

1668 Nov<sup>r</sup>. 28 — Francis Small purchased of Capt Sunday "all that my tract of land at Osagee containing twenty miles square, lying between the two rivers of Great and Little Osagee, and being the same where the said Small's trading house now stands and from the River Newichewanock near Humphrey Chabourne's logging camp and to extend northerly and easterly to Saco River" signed sealed & delivered in presence of Witnesses

Recorded in York County Lib. 42 fol. 239 on Aug<sup>r</sup>. 28 1773. — See N<sup>o</sup>. 6
