1442. Bill to prohibit Boom, Dam and Mill owners from stopping and detaining logs in certain cases.

Resolve additional for the payment of accounts against the State, (reported by the Committee on Accounts,) severally read the second time and passed to be engrossed as amended, in concurrence.

Resolve authorizing the sale of lands reserved for public uses;

Bill to enlarge the powers of Constables in the town of Diamond, (introduced in the House,) severally read twice and laid upon the table.

Bill to authorize the inhabitants of Bluehill to build a ^{free} Bridge over tide waters came up. The Senate refused any action on said Bill: the Legislature having granted leave to withdraw on petition for said Bridge.

Mr Burr, from the Conference, on a disagreeing vote of the two Houses on the "Bill to incorporate the St. Croix Land and Mill Company," reported that the Conference had agreed to report the Bill with an amendment—read and accepted.

The Senate adopt the amendment proposed by the Conference and passed said Bill to be engrossed as amended—and the title of the Bill was amended, so as to read, "Bill to incorporate the Schoodic and Baileyville Land and Mill Company;" Sent down for concurrence. Concurred.
