

Lerry had heard about Mohawks going on St. Francis Falls "Just a bunch of Mohawks" were coming down to
 Iriquo. They up towards head of St. Johns Lake two families
 hunting. The Mohawks killed the men and took
 the women for guides. When they got down to the mouth
 of the St. Francis the Mohawks asked the women about
 how the river was below. The women said it was for
 a long ways all easy water. "Could they build a raft?"
 "Yes, and could drift down a long ways". So they
 built a big raft. Along towards night the women told
 them it would be dark all night before they got
 into rough water. So the Mohawks said "Go run
 raft, or go sleep" So the women were left alone
 to guide the raft. When they got near the Grand
 Falls the women guided the raft so they could
 slip off and get ashore & then the Mohawks the
 raft out into the stream. And the whole bunch
 of the boat on the falls. And of a log tree the
 men lay around on ~~the~~ ^{all the rocks} below just
 like dry Ki."
