I find that to indicate ownership of particular "figures" would be marked on the skin, "snake, animal, cres, anything; have known deer, moose, lizard, otter & bear so on," says Lewis Kitchman, "But they would use different marks."

Lewey says Mr. J. M. ^{Reptiles} ~~Allen's~~ mark was - snake - and told us how one when the former's fur had been stolen, he followed to the seller and got the fur in possession of - dealer and found that the snake and got the mark. I find there were several families of Totem names but could get at this sitting of the Wasawo (Bear) and the Lemxore (a allaksoo) a Volvime (Brain devil) family. Joe Becker mentions the ~~Hummingbird~~ gens, the bear and the Sturgeon gens. (Red Man p. 147.)

Somewhere the dog clan is spoken of - as half bear, a three gutter reports. Is it by Abbe' Maurant?

I have failed to make out anything definite on the - Raccoon family, now (1917) all gone. One declares the Reptile mark a fish - is salt water - high water. Lewey does not know whether Reptile is duck or deer.
