Order from the House of Representatives, instructing the Committee on the Judiciary to inquire whether any, and what alterations are necessary to be made in the law of this State, regulating the sale of spirituous liquors— read and passed in concurrence.

On motion of M<sup>r</sup>. A. R. Redman.

Ordered, that a message be sent to the House of Representatives, proposing a convention of the two Houses, in the Representatives Hall to morrow at eleven o'clock, A. M. for the purpose of electing a Treasurer of State for the current political year, and requesting the concurrence of the House. Which message was delivered by the Secretary.

A message was received from the House of Representatives, that that Branch had concurred in the foregoing proposition.

On motion of M<sup>r</sup>. Littlefield.

Ordered, that Messrs. Littlefield, Severance, and J. R. Redman, with such as the House may join, be a Committee to contract with some suitable person to do the State printing for the present year. Sent down for concurrence.
